From the Pastor's Desk

In April, I had the opportunity to attend a mission conference sponsored by the World Mission Initiative at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. My friend Marilyn Borst, who works with The Outreach Foundation and who has spoken at Clen-Moore, was speaking on the state of the church in Syria. I was humbled by the stories she shared about the church's faith and perseverance during such trying times.

It caused me to think about two things: What excuses do I allow to get in the way of ministry? And what things might keep us away from church on any given Sunday? Perhaps it was just a long week and we just feel too tired. Maybe the weather. And, if we are willing to admit it, there are those Sundays when we just want a free pass.

I was humbled to hear Marilyn share how the Presbyterian Church in Damascus was filled to overflowing with 150 in attendance on Sunday morning. Like most Sunday mornings over the past several years, the air was punctuated by the not-sodistant rumble of exploding artillery just three miles away. Many members of the congregation had made their way past the concrete blast walls and hulking camouflage tanks that guarded the entrance to the Christian quarter of the city.

"In him was life, and that light was the life of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." ~John 1:4, 5

These difficulties were not enough to keep the congregation from gathering to sing with



passion and pray with fervor.

I sheepishly thought about the excuses I use. None of which hold a candle to artillery and tanks. The light has remained lit and is burning brightly in this brave and persevering church. May we learn from and be inspired by their lives of faith and faithfulness.

- What's ahead? June will bring: Confirmation Sunday & Graduation Sunday, June 1st; Go-Karts and Wing Night for K.F.C.





Brianna Pilch, daughter of Greg & Cheryl Pilch and a youth in our congregation, was recently diagnosed with Chiari I Malformation and Syringomyelia. Those are big medical terms which, simply put, mean part of Brianna's brain has been pushed downward into the upper spinal canal. As a result, Brianna must undergo brain surgery, which has been scheduled for May 14.

What's Happening...?

Clen-Moore's Opening Doors building campaign continues with all the "little" things that go on with a project of this size. Progress is being made constantly and it won't be too long before we are complaining about everything being torn up!

Meanwhile, many members have been reaching out to make Opening Doors much more than just a building campaign.

Did you know that a group of adults who are intellectually disabled meet at Clen-Moore on Thursday nights for Bible study and singing, good food and fellowship? About 3-10 people typically attend. If you know someone who would benefit from this group, please call the church office and we will reach out to them and invite them to this program.

Some members have been involved with a program call "Feed My Sheep," which involves serving a meal once a week to those in need. Members have also contributed to a small renovation project to improve a building used by Feed My Sheep.

Another program reaching out to help hungry local children is the Lawrence County Summer Food Program. Clen-Moore members are also considering a program that will feed children who have nothing to eat on the weekends during the school year. It is unbelievable that so many children have nothing to eat when there's no school to provide it!

Our youth have taken part in several projects working with the less fortunate. And men from the Men's Ministry have reached out to visit those in need, to show that someone cares.

Some Caring Friends volunteers have reached out to people outside Clen-Moore's membership. While delivering gifts to people in assisted living, volunteers have come in contact with others who say they wish they had someone to visit them. Caring Friends have added six more people to the list they visit – people who don't have anyone else.

We have definitely seen Clen-Moore people reaching out to follow the Scripture verse "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."
