Many have asked, "Why these changes? Why now?" Several years ago, the congregation received a generous gift from the Genkinger family to build a covered entrance into the church. While planning this project, the Session thought it was a good time to look at other needs of the church building, especially

the needs of the Sanctuary. Adding a covered entrance to the church will:

- Provide a safe. attractive entrance that will protect people from the elements
- Provide more handicapped parking
- Provide an "obvious" main entrance into the church
- Conveniently locate the Office at this main entrance

The proposed changes to the Sanctuary will:

Improve the flexibility of the worship space



- Make necessary updates to the sound system
- Provide technology • for use in worship
- Improve accessibil-• ity to the Chancel and choir loft

These changes are significant and important to the growth of our church. We seek your blessing as we move forward in the life of our congregation.



"We told you earlier of the home Kevin & Wendy Mason owned in Estonia that went up in flames on April 13. Their hope was to rebuild and have a home for unwed mothers. However, they learned June 25 that the insurance company said that "...due to carelessness in causing the fire, they will not honor the claim." The Masons have contacted their bank, a friend in the insurance business, a COO for4 a non-profit, the church who is part of establishing this house as a home for unwed mothers, and other friends. They are learning what action steps we'll need to take, but I am asking that you join us in the most important action of all: regular, concerted praver for resolution of this legitimate claim. Meanwhile, the Masons are in the US for the remainder of the summer and can be reached at (724) 651-8280.


