# **Community Thanksgiving Service**




The annual Presbyterian community

#### **Mission Memo**

Alexandre Auguste Ladrun-Rollins, a French lawyer and politician, once said: "There go my people. I must follow them, for I am their leader." That is how Ceci and I sometimes feel as we attempt to keep up with what God is doing in Latin America through LATCOM.

We just spent August in Bolivia, reviewing and shooting video footage of current ministries, as well as praying for and planning for future outreach. In all these areas, we were thrilled to see spiritual and physical growth. At the same time, we were filled with hope/plans/ideas of how we - and ultimately YOU - can become involved in what God is already doing.

For example, we need several work teams in Bolivia and in Pennsylvania to continue building churches, training VBS and youth workers, repairing current structures,

motor vehicles and equipment. In Pennsylvania, we need teams to repair the LATCOM office building, to build shelves in the kitchen area, and to replace the porch and finish the upstairs on the mission home in Ellwood City.

As for family news, Chuck continues to live in the mission house in Ellwood City, which has been adapted to accommodate his walker. He is working on writing his memoirs of the more than 60 years spent in mission work. Medically speaking, he continues to weaken from congestive heart failure and complications from diabetes. Yet his attitude is as positive as always. He goes to therapy, church, doctor's appointments, and family outings as much as possible. He plans to travel in October to speak at some donor churches.

Brian and Julie Reagle have

joined LATCOM. Julie is our daughter so this will be a third-generation mission family. Their expertise and enthusiasm have already made a huge difference in the home office. Brian completed his bachelor's degree in business administration and Julie is working on a master's degree in counseling. They are parents of six children.


