From the Pastor's Desk: Come, Lord Jesus! Our Lord Has Come!

Since the first century, as Christians await the advent of the true Light, they have uttered the word *Maranatha*, often translated "Our Lord, come!" Maranatha may be two words with differing translations:

> <u>marana-tha</u>: "Come, our Lord!" (looking to the future)

<u>maran-atha</u>: "Our Lord has Come!" (looking to the past)

The use of this word during the season of Advent emphasizes both our remembering of the past and our hope for the future. In Advent, the beginning and the end times meet. We live between both words, the future coming of the Lord and our belief that the Lord has come as God's ultimate acting history.

In Advent, we expectantly wait for the One who has already come. We anticipate the promised justice of God's new world, yet we praise God who has raised the "righteous branch" to rule with justice and righteousness. We long for the beating of swords into plowshares, yet we rejoice



that the Prince of Peace has appeared. During Advent, therefore, our eyes are focused on God's future promised in Jesus Christ. At Christmas, we rejoice that the future has arrived.

As we wrap up the beginning of the "Opening Doors" campaign, we are in the midst of another advent, looking back and

STUDENT CONFIRMATION PROGRAM

Clen-Moore is offering our Confirmation program for students in grades 8-12. This program is for students who desire a more serious and public commitment to Jesus Christ and to participate in what He is doing at Clen-Moore Church.

In some ways, Confirmation is like joining a team. When you play on a team, you get to participate in the game at a greater depth than when you are on the sidelines simply watching and cheering. It says to your teammates, "Hey, I like this game enough to want to be a larger part of it. I wish to join the team."

Aaron will work with students and their families to accomplish what is described below. It may sound like a lot, but in reality, it is simply a matter of planning and time management. Our Confirmation program is a two-tiered program that consists of:

- 1. Four to five classes with teaching and discussion about our church, the Christian faith, and Presbyterians. This is done with Pastor Chris or Aaron on various Sunday mornings. Attendance is mandatory.
- 2. Each student is paired up with an adult from the church, who becomes a mentor to the student, to complete multiple action/reflection-based activities within the life of the church. Students will be paired with adults who are active in the worship and ministry life of Clen-Moore Church and of the same gender (no family members).

Students and mentors will be given a binder that will have a variety of activities to participate in together. They will be guided by things to think about before participating in each activity. After participating, they will reflect on and discuss their experience.

Students will have four months to complete these activities.

After writing a one-page Statement of Faith that reflects on their Confirmation journey and a meeting with Session, students will be received into Membership before Pentecost Sunday (likely June 1, 2014).

The deadline to sign-up is Sunday, January 12, so that we can begin pairing you up with a mentor. Contact Aaron Christy to express interest and with any questions that you may have.
