From the Pastor's Desk: General Assembly 2014

This month I will attend the 221st General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). In the Spring, I was elected as one of the commissioners to represent Shenango Presbytery. I will be in Detroit June 14 - 21 and will serve on the Mission Committee.

The General Assembly of the P.C.(U.S.A.) meets biennially, in even-numbered years. It consists of commissioners elected by each of its 173 presbyteries. The GA is full of activities: business sessions, committee meetings, an

exhibit hall, daily worship services, and mission tours.

The assembly acts on the hundreds of items of business which it receives through the reports and recommendations of various assembly entities, and through overtures from synods and presbyteries.

The two most controversial issues to be dealt with this summer are overtures to amend the Directory for Worship to read that "marriage is a civil contract between two peo-



ple." The second is a recommendation from The Committee on Mission Responsibility Through Investment (MRTI) to divest from three corporations— Caterpillar, Hewlett Packard and Motorola Solutions—not in compliance with General Assembly of the P.C. (U.S.A.) policy on socially responsible investing. Since 2004, General Assemblies have directed MRTI to use the church's

each summer to ensure maximum effectiveness against sunburn and the possibility of skin cancer later in life.

Here are some notes from around Clen-Moore:

- Some of our youth have enjoyed a wonderful experience while taking joy to members of our church. The youth spent time reading and praying as well as talking about how to care for others. Then they went to visit some members of our church. Afterwards, they gathered and had ice cream. They said they learned a lot about Christian joy and the people they visited were very appreciative.
 - The teens will continue in mission work. They have finished a study of the Ten Commandments. Their theme this summer will be "His Hands."
- The New Castle Christian Academy is expanding its program and adding a 9th grade. Clen-Moore will be a part of this as NCCA will be using three rooms during the week next school year for the 7th, 8th, and 9th grades. The interest in this private Christian school continues to grow.
- Big Brothers/Big Sisters continues its program at Clen-Moore.

 The kids that started out being small have now be-

- come teenagers. This is a challenge to those from our church who are working with them. Our members have been "up to the challenge" and are able to help these youth know Christ and His love. This program continues to grow across the country. We can help by hosting a youth, providing a meal, or offering to host the youth and their sponsors for a picnic.
- Prime Timers have Bible study each week. It is basically senior citizens, but anyone is welcome. They will meet at the Hutchison center at Pearson Park in the summer. New members are always welcome.
- Did you know that a group of adults who are intellectually challenged are meeting at Clen-Moore on some Thursday evenings for Bible study and singing, along with just good food and fellowship? If you know someone who would benefit by belonging to this group, please call the church office and we will reach out to them and invite them to this program.
- Some of our members have been working with a program in New Castle called "Feed My Sheep." Clen-Moore is looking into taking responsibility for one

- meal a month, on a Thursday at noon. Your participation would be appreciated.
- Clen-Moore is now helping to sponsor a program that will start this fall and help feed school children who do not have food to eat on the weekend. This is being done through the New Castle Area School District. It is unbelievable that so many children have nothing to eat at home when the school doesn't provide it.

With all that's happening in our church, it's easy to see Clen-Moore people reaching out to follow the Scripture verse "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." ~ Matthew 25:40
