From the Pastor's Desk: Ash Wednesday

The season of Lent prepares us for the splendor of Easter and the power of the resurrection. We begin by turning our attention to the stark realities of our human existence. Our world is filled with sin and death. The Good News of Christ's redemption is good news only in so far as we recognize and confront our frailty and weakness. Lent asks us to remember this truth as we make our way to Easter, and the symbol with which we start our Lenten journey is ashes.

Often the use of ashes is thought of as being too "Catholic. The truth is that ashes have been used as a sign of penitence in the time before Christ as well as in the early church. The use of ashes is a sign of our humanity and a reminder of our mortality. So it is that the journey from Lent to Easter is a journey from death to life, from ashes to fire.

On February 18, we will join together with the other Presbyterian churches in New Castle to begin the season of Lent. We will have a light supper at 6:00 PM in Fellowship Hall, to be followed by an Ash Wednesday service in the Sanctuary. The service will include singing, prayers, a brief message and, if you wish, the imposition of



ashes. You may also write on a card those things you wish to repent of and pin them to the cross.

At the appropriate time during the service, the worship leaders will model the imposition of ashes with one another. This will be followed by an open invitation for anyone to come forward to participate. You may choose to have the ashes imposed on your forehead or the back of a hand.

Mission Memo

Caleb International Ministries:

Rev. Louis LaGatta spent almost 3 weeks in Hyderabad, South Central India, after traveling for 30 continuous hours, on 3 different flights, and adjusting to a 10 and 1/2 hour time zone change.

Living conditions in India are "challenging." The population and poverty are overwhelming. The masses of the poor struggle to survive, while many live in excessive luxury. The majority of the people are Hindu, with an almost equal number of people who are Muslim. About 10 percent of the country is Christian, shining the Light of the Salvation in the midst of Darkness.

For the next 5 years, India will be the priority focus and objective of the International Division of Caleb International Ministries with the objectives to (1) conduct Pastor/ Leadership Conferences in Hyderabad and Eluru, and (2) develop a Strategic Plan for the establishment of a Ministry Training Center. They have partnered with the Mahanaim Full Gospel Church Ministries. There are only 3 Bible Schools (Lutheran, Baptist and Penecostal), preparing men and women for ministry in the greater metropolitan area of Hyderabad and Secunderabad, with a combined population of 12 million plus. Projected start date is September, 2015.

"Christmas Greetings from Dembi Dollo! We have settled in quite well. It's hard to believe we've been in Africa for almost a year! We are both well entrenched into teaching. Brenda has over 230 students in Grades 11 & 12. She has also started a class for National Exam Prep and a class for those students who need a little extra help with English. She

loves her students.

Steve is having an eye opening first term. Though he has only 43 students in 3 classes, many of his students have only completed 10th grade, yet many have been pastors for over 10 years. Gidada is a lifetime opportunity for them - the gift of upgrading their education at the only school that offers a Reformed Presbyterian education!

As I write this, the sun is shining and the weather is a balmy 70 degrees. It is hard to believe it's the season of Thanksgiving and Advent. Yet at this time, we do give thanks - especially for You! And your partnership in serving Christ here in Ethiopia. May God grant you a joyous Christmas and a New Year filled with His peace!
