From the Pastor's Desk: Seeing Him Who Is Invisible

"By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be known as the son of Pharaoh's daughter. He chose to be mistreated along with the people of God rather than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. He regarded disgrace for the sake of Christ as of greater value than the treasures of Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward. By faith he left Egypt, not fearing the king's anger; he persevered because he saw him who is invisible."

~ Hebrews 11:24-27

Even the worst and most painful family experiences become part of our identity. God had a plan in placing us in our particular families and cultures. The more we know about our families, the more we know about ourselves - and the more freedom we have to make decisions

about how we want to live.

If we ignore truth out of fear, we end up like Mrs. Havisham from Charles Dickens's novel Great Expectations. The daughter of a wealthy man, she received a letter on her wedding day at 8:40 A.M. that her husband to be was not coming. She stopped all the clocks in the house at the precise time the letter arrived and spent the rest of her life in her bridal dress.

Even as an elderly woman, she remained crippled by the weight of that crushing blow. It was as if everything in the room and house had stopped. She de-



cided to live in her past, not her present or future.

Moses' life had more than its fair share of pain and failure. Raised in a wealthy, privileged home, he murders a man, losses everything, and spends the next forty years of his life in obscurity in the desert. Yet, by faith, he "sees him who is invisible" and hears God's invitation to do something that will be a

Collection bins will be placed in Circle Drive and the Welcome Area from Sunday, Oct. 11 through Sunday, Nov. 1.


We will also assist the City Rescue Mission as they partner with Giant Eagle for the "Fall Food Share" food drive, held each fall at local Giant Eagle locations.
