From the Pastor's Desk: Reaching Out To Somebody

Over the past several months, Clen-Moore has responded to requests for help in our community with great generosity.

In December, we started to collect coats for the Salvation Army and boots & socks for children to be distributed by Cray. Your response was tremendous.

On December 12th, we hosted a community Christmas concert with A Circle of Friends Choirs. A free will offering was taken for the Lawrence County Backpacking Program. Once again, your response was tremendous; more than \$1,000 was received.

I am reminded of the words Mother Teresa wrote in her book, *Words to Love By:* "How

do we show that we love Christ? By giving wholehearted free service to the poorest of the poor. We believe it is to Jesus. This thing, if it were not for Jesus, would not be worth doing.


Health Note:

"To boost your metabolic rate, exercise more.

Your metabolic rate is the rate at which your body uses energy - the number of calories it burns in a given period of time, either at rest or while active.

If your resting metabolic rate is high, you may find that you can eat a lot, exercise little, and not gain weight. Conversely, if your metabolic rate is low, you may eat relatively little and be fairly active, and still not lose weight.

Most people approach weight control wrong: they simply try



to tone down on the food, fat, and calories they consume and they usually fail. The trick is to stoke up the furnace -- that is, increase the number of calories your body burns all day. Obviously, exercise burns calories, but it also boosts your metabolic rate."



Mandatory Child Abuse Training Workshop

Sunday, January 24 11:45 AM

Clen-Moore Church will hold a mandatory workshop to train our adult volunteers and staff who work with children and youth (infant to under 18 years old) on the new PA State Laws, called Keep Kids Safe PA, in regards to child abuse, obtaining clearances, and mandatory reporting. In response to the new state laws Clen-Moore Church has also written a new Child Abuse Policy, which will be reviewed and discussed.

So, if you volunteer in any way with children and youth, for any Clen-Moore Church related program or function, for any amount of time (once a year to once a week) you must attend this workshop, or by law, you will be forced to suspend your volunteering effective July 1, 2016 or until training is done and clearances are obtained. This includes, but not limited to:

Sunday School teachers, youth leaders, nursery workers, VBS volunteers, Children in Worship, children's choir, etc.

If for whatever reason you are unable to attend, please notify Pastor Chris a week in advance so that we can put you on the makeup workshop list. This is a very serious thing and should not be brushed aside.

You do not need to have your clearances by this workshop, but if you have not yet obtained updated clearances, we will inform you on how to go about doing that and provide help if needed. If you already have updated your clearances (State Police Criminal Background & Child Abuse Background) for another volunteer position or for your vocation, please bring the original copies and we will copy them during this meeting.

By law, another form for volunteers will need to be signed at this workshop along with discussion of the aforementioned mandatory reporting of child abuse and discussing our new church child abuse policy.

The workshop will take place in Fellowship Hall on Sunday, January 24, following worship. The Christian Education Committee will prepare a light lunch. The meeting will be approximately 60-90 minutes.

or needing clothes and clothe you? ³⁹When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?'

40"The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me."

Christians reach out to the poor and needy not necessarily for reasons of equality, social action or human rights. These motivations pale in comparison to belief that in serving the poor and needy, we are serving Jesus himself.

As we continue to reach out to our community, let us remember that we do this not to grow the church nor make ourselves feel better, but rather we do this *to* Somebody: Jesus the Lord.
