From the Pastor's Desk: The Adaptable Church

It is hard for most people to believe, but the history of the church is one of great adaptability. As the church expanded into different cultures so the practice of Christians changed. The church in Africa worships with dance and drums. The church in Europe adopted the organ in worship. In the time of the reformation in Germany, "drinking songs" were changed to sing praise to God. While not changing the gospel, the church has adapted to different times and places.

The church in our culture is entering a time of great change. New ministries often develop through adaptation and experimentation by trial and error. For example: a church in a small town was keen to reach out to young families. Holding worship and social meetings in a local garage proved, however, to be more attractive to the

local youth, and 'Garage Praise' was born.

Adaptation is part of God's creation. What is evolution if it is not a history of adaptation? One species flourishes, another doesn't, a third mutates. It is as if each is asking, 'What will work in this context?' God has chosen adaptation to propel creation.

Likewise, civilization is the product of successful experimentation and adaptation – from houses that fit their environment, to regional diets, to systems of government. Every manufactured thing around us is a successful experiment. Flops have long been forgotten. Experimentation is an essential part of being human.

So when churches experiment, Christians are being true to themselves, as creatures made to experiment. They are also reflecting



the character of God, who loves adaptation and experimentation so much that he has built it into the template of creation.

The church seems to be entering a period of more active experimentation. This experimentation focuses not on the details of church life but on the very essence of church. Many new and different forms of church are being started in a variety of contexts. Often local churches are flying blind, not sure what will really work.

Quite a few experiments have failed to develop as originally hoped, and many remain fragile. It is in the nature of experiments that many do not work. But there have been plenty of encouragements as well. It's an exciting time for Chris-



We are privileged to have many people in our congregation involved in NCCA parents, students, alumni, board members, teachers and staff.

NCCA was formed in 1991, during a teachers' strike in the New Castle Area School District. From its humble beginnings, a ministry of academic



In its 25 years, NCCA has produced at least 20 high school valedictorians/salutatorians.

Countless numbers of children and their parents have accepted Christ through the school.

NCCA teachers & staff view their work as a mission; starting teachers' salaries are just \$15,000 per year.

Clen-Moore participates in this mission in many ways. Pastor Chris Weichman and our Di-

rector of Youth & Family Ministries, Aaron Christy, have both conducted weekly Chapel services at the school. Our church supports the school financially, as well, with regular contributions as well as occasional emergency funds.

Throughout the month of April, several Clen-Moore members with a connection to NCCA will share their experiences with this important church mission. We hope you will be blessed by their testimonies.

HEALTH TIP - Exercise Improves Children's Working Memory

School children who participated in a 10 week aerobic exercise program (45 minutes per session, 3 times a week), experienced improvements in working memory when compared with children in a control group. The children in both groups were provided with homework assistance sessions during the same time frame. The results suggest that children would not only benefit physically from regular physical exercise, but academically as well.


