Dear church family,

You may be wondering how Pastor Aaron and I choose who preaches on a given Sunday. When my grandmother asked me following our installation service, I joked "We flip a coin Sunday morning. It's like a pop quiz in school; it forces you to always be prepared!" But in all seriousness, I wanted to share that I will be preaching all of October with a series focused on eliminating false gods in our lives.

We are quick to turn to the Ten Commandments when we seek the most basic moral compass that the Bible provides for us. Some are quick to lament the lack of blue laws and the prevalence of soccer games on Sundays, making Sabbath observance less faithful. Most of us have known not to commit murder or steal—even non-Christians live by many of these 'ethical standards'. But what about the first two: "You shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself an idol" (Exodus 20:3-4). What makes us different? WHAT WE WORSHIP!

I have heard it said before that it isn't a matter of IF we worship, but WHAT we worship in life. We know that as Christians we worship Jesus Christ. However, there are many false gods we worship that get in the way—everything from status to money, power, family, food, and even personal preference. Sin is anything that stands between us and God. Anything that we 'worship' (i.e. care more about than God almighty) is considered an idol.

This month-long series will examine the hidden false gods that plague our lives. As we do so, I pray that we would all examine our lives and understand how these idols take our focus and energy away from worshiping and serving Jesus Christ. If you want an easy-to-read and helpful book on the subject as we dive in, read "Gods at War" by Kyle Idleman. Some of his ideas will serve as inspiration for the series.

Youth Ministry Update

As part of the road ahead and with me being co-pastor, the youth leaders and I have met and did some re-visioning of how we would go about doing youth ministry in this new time. I shared in June with the youth and their families that some things would not change at all, some things would change just a little, and other things would change a bit more. Keeping with this promise, we will continue to hold regular youth group meetings the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month. We will have a regular youth meeting at the church on the 1st Sun-

day. Then, the youth leaders are in charge of planning a fun activity or mission event the 3rd Sunday of each month. In addition, we will be exploring some new opportunities to do just for the older youth to take part in. The biggest change is that we are bringing in a Student Youth Director Intern from Westminster College to take part in leading the 1st Sunday of the month youth ministry meetings. Then, this person will also teach the Jr./Sr. High Sunday School class on a regular basis. I will work directly with the Intern and help this person along the way. This means that I will be present at most youth events, just not for the whole time and giving space when needed. The person we have in mind is still in the interview stage and I hope to introduce you all to him by the time you get this information. Look for a calendar of events from October through May in your email. We are very excited about this new way forward with our youth ministry as other potential opportunities are in the works as well!


Featured: Movie: I CAN ONLY IMAGINE
