Baby Steps and Big Steps

The joy of it is that they get right back up and keep trying, until it becomes easier and easier.

Shenango Church and Clen-Moore Church have taken some baby steps moving towards what we believe is our future that God is calling us to and becoming one congregation. We have shared co-pastors, we have joined for worship together and service projects, we have had education and fundraiser events, and we have shared meals together.

Also, we have taken some big steps. On Sunday, November 24, Shenango voted to sell their manse, which is a big step in the process as we move towards our goal of uniting permanently as one congregation. There are a number of small steps that we continue to take as we share in worship together on multiple occasions this Advent and Christmas season. The Gospel works in small and big steps as well. Often times it finds its way into our lives in small ways, a little at a time, slowly transforming us. Then, there are occasions in our lives when the Gospel breaks through in a big and powerful way, making a huge transformation in us.

Both of these things were happening on that first Christmas Day, as God was at work in the lives of His covenant people Israel, breaking in a little at a time and taking baby steps. Then, there was that big step, as the Christ-child, the Incarnate Son of God was born into our world and it changed everything! It soon opened up the way to salvation, bringing joy to the world.

In the middle of the 5th Century, St. Leo the Great shared these encouraging words in his Christmas sermon; "Our Savior, dearly-beloved, was born today: let us be glad. For there is no proper place for sadness, when we keep the birth day of the Life, which destroys the fear of mortality and brings to us the joy of promised eternity. No one is kept from sharing in this happiness. There is for all one common measure of joy, because as our Lord the destroyer of sin and death finds none free from charge, so is He come to free us all. Let the Christian believer exult in that he draws near to victory. Let the sinner be glad in that he is invited to pardon. Let the gentile take courage in that he is called to life."

As we draw near to Jesus Christ this advent season and celebrate the coming together of the human and divine in the same one person, let us approach the manger with joy and excitement. Whether we approach Christmas with baby steps or with one big step, the point is that we approach, and draw near to Him who calls us out of darkness and into the Light. Amen.
