Dear Church Family,

While there are different ways of thinking about it, growing in our faith in Jesus is about change management—allowing ourselves to be conformed to the ways of Christ. It is a common thought at the beginning of any New Year, making decisions to become better and healthier than the year before. It reminds me of the words the prophet spoke in Isaiah 43:19, "I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." The Mission and Evangelism Committee of Clen-Moore has worked hard at perceiving how we are called to participate in mission in the world around us, as well as how to engage our church to participate in it more fully.

In case you did not already know, Clen-Moore has made strong financial commitments to local and international mission work for many years. We tithe, or commit ten percent of our giving to mission. In this upcoming year, that will equate to roughly \$40,000 of support! While our level of financial commitments remains largely unchanged, how we are approaching the work will be a bit different. One of which is we will be supporting a smaller number of mission partners, but giving more to them, allowing us to be more invested in their work financially, prayerfully, and physically. Everything we have supported in the past is a worthy cause, but when funds and effort get spread too thin, the effectiveness of that work often suffers.

The Mission Committee will be highlighting a mission every month, which gives us the ability to give the spotlight to all our mission efforts over the course of the year. Our hope is that this will give our church a clearer sense of how we are serving God's kingdom BE-YOND our doors, and opportunities to engage in this work. So as the year rolls by, and you witness to the ways God is working in the world around us, perceive a new thing that may be springing forth. When a mission or ministry is highlighted that tugs at your heart strings, let that be a sign that God may be calling you to serve him in that way.
