

# December,2020

In a year with many firsts, this Advent season will likely prove to be different than many before it. First, to help ensure there is 'enough room in the inn', our sanctuary, we will hold two worship services this Christmas Eve. The first will be a slightly informal, family-oriented service at 5PM. Our second service will begin at 7:30PM, a more traditional service with hymns. Both services will include the tradition of singing Silent Night by candlelight. We are also asking folks to 'RSVP' by Tuesday, December 22nd in the church office to help us gauge the number we can expect at each service. Both services will also be live streamed, so if you are uncomfortable attending in person or are not feeling well, please join us online.

It has been a weird year for your pastors and the leadership of Clen-Moore when it comes to everything we have had to consider. In a lot of ways, however, this is the story of Christmas. Mary could have never anticipated that she, an average Jewish girl, would be given one of the greatest tasks of all human history—miraculously give birth to the Messiah, Jesus Christ. If an angel would have visited a year ago and said, "You will have to pastor a church during an unprecedented time over the next nine months," we would have responded less gracefully than Mary. It is safe to say few of us would.

The disruption caused by COVID-19 pales in comparison to such a gargantuan task, yet we have to wonder if it could help us understand how she felt. Mary's account of her miraculous encounter can be found in Luke 1:26-38. The presence of the angel Gabriel bringing this news first stirs a degree of fear in Mary, followed by confusion about how this would all come to be. After more explanation from Gabriel, Mary accepts the task and does so with positive anticipation in verse 38: "Here I am, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word."

Advent is the season leading up to Christmas where we anticipate that our fear and confusion would be transformed into hope and joy. Fear is what we experience when we have concern for our future; hope is trusting that our present day will someday become a bright future. Confusion sets in when things we take for granted disappear from under our feet; joy is having our feet firmly planted on the only immovable object in the universe—Jesus Christ.

For years Christians have bemoaned the commercialization of Christmas. Now that so much of that has been stripped away, maybe instead of asking "How did we end up here?", we might instead exclaim, like Mary, "Here we are, servants of the Lord; let it be with us according to your word." The moral of so many Christmas books, movies, and musicals is the reminder that our stuff does not (or should not) matter nearly as much as the ones we love. More specifically, as Christians, we are loved by God through the gift of our Messiah. We can still hope for a brighter tomorrow while continuing to experience the joy He has already brought us. And just as Mary makes a shift from fear and confusion to hope and joy, I pray that the next four Sundays of Advent will help us make the same shift in our own faith.
