FINANCIAL NEWS:

In the past year, our church has been blessed with a little more than \$376,000 from the estates of William Morrison and Robert Brinton. The session has designated that 10% of these gifts be directed to the Mission Fund and the balance to the Capital Reserve Fund. This has returned the fund to a positive \$293,000.00 after having a negative balance for a couple of years. While very grateful for these generous donations, they will be used for some ongoing needs of the church building and grounds and not the daily operations. 



August—1-2-1 Mentoring

Cray has been working to make life better for kids since 1984, and has been sponsoring our mentoring program since 1997. For over 20 years, we were an affiliate of Big Brothers Big Sisters of America. We had to part ways with BBBS in 2017 due to new requirements that were going to substantially raise the cost of our operations, but continue to use the model today to deliver high quality mentoring services to youth and volunteers in our community under the name "1-to-1 Mentoring Lawrence County".

One of our strongest partnerships over the past 12 years has been with Clen-Moore Church. Thanks to a few dedicated volunteers, over 20 kids in our community have been matched with a mentor in the Monday night program. Some of the kids we served years ago are now adults going to college, working, and raising families! One of our first mentees, Jaimie, still comes almost every Monday that we meet to offer support and encouragement to the kids and volunteers who are currently in the program. There are currently 8 matches in the program. We continue to meet twice a month with activities hosted by Clen-Moore once a month and Highland Presbyterian once a month. We offer a mix of activities that includes educational, community service, and just plain fun. We also make it a point to share a meal together and pray together each time we are together as a group. We have had some interruptions due to COVID over this past year, but things are feeling more and more "normal" each time we meet, and we are thankful for that!

Mission Spotlight!

July—Alpha Omega/Promise of Life Network

Promise of Life Network is a pregnancy medical center with six distinct ministry divisions and locations in New Castle, Slippery Rock, Sandy Lake, and Butler. Locally, Promise of Life Network provides pregnancy testing, ultrasound scans, STD testing and treatment, parenting education and material help for young families along with abstinence education, post abortive support, and post-miscarriage support. Internationally, we work with women in developing nations to educate them about their pregnancy options and encourage them to choose life.

We are excited to work with Clen-Moore Presbyterian by providing education materials, updates, and volunteer opportunities to the congregation and grateful for everyone's help and support. So far this year we have had 23 local at-risk moms choose life for their unborn children, and over 3,000 international contacts. We are also excited to welcome our parenting clients back to inperson office visits. Thank you all for your prayers and your sup-

Our goal is to be serving 12 matches in the Clen-Moore Highland Church programs by this time next year- with just a few more volunteers, we can easily meet that goal. If you're not sure about mentoring but want to help, consider hosting a Monday night event! If you have a business or job you love and want to teach us about it, we would love to listen. If you have the ability to host a picnic or party for our matches, that would be great! We want our kids to feel a part of the church, and the best way to do that is to let them meet as many of you that they can!

Building & Grounds

Update on Building & Grounds Committee and Session:

As you know, we have been blessed with a beautiful church building and property, which, with any building our size and age, also costs money for upkeep. The Building and Grounds Committee has been working to prioritize a number of larger work projects that need to be done over different periods of time so that we can keep up with repairs and so that they don't become more expensive to do. With the monetary blessing from the estates that The Steward and Finance Committee reported in this Messenger edition, we are able to start on some of these repairs and upkeeps. Therefore, you will see a few work projects being done through the summer that total in estimates just under \$73,000. They include paving, caulking and lining the upper parking lot; repairing cement on sidewalks and steps around the church; and placing overlay asphalt and relining lower parking lot and driveways. There are more projects to do in the future and we will be sharing more about them as well. Thank you.
