#### September—Dominican Republic Mission Partnership

For nearly 30 years, several churches in western Pennsylvania and southern Ohio have engaged in a cross-cultural, Christian mission partnership with the ministry of La Iglesia Evangelica Dominicana in the Dominican Republic. This church was found by Presbyterian and Methodist missionaries around 1922. Clen-Moore Presbyterian Church became involved in 2007 when our then interim pastor, Bill Meyer, challenged our congregation to become involved in this meaningful partnership.

Each visit made by the travel team is an opportunity to be a witness to the love and blessing of Jesus in Sabaneta de Yasica, on the northern coast of the island. Yet each visit is also a chance for us to learn about ministry, in a culture different from our own.

The main partnership areas include provision of medical clinics for the community, medical home visits incorporating therapy and medical needs, construction projects, teacher to teacher instruction, children and youth activities including Bible school, and the scholarship program which provides tuition assistance for deserving elementary, high school, and college age students.

The trip to Sabaneta de Yasica was cancelled due to the Covid-19 pandemic in 2020 and 2021, but the work of the partnership continued behind the scenes as much as possible to keep our partnership moving forward. We are beyond excited for the 2022 trip which has been scheduled for March 12-19!
