Dear Church Family,

Have you ever been so excited to get something that you know you eagerly wanted, but then once you got it you did not use it? It just sat on a shelf, in a cabinet, closet, or a drawer. The excitement of getting the thing that you wanted dissipated after it was yours. Maybe it was a book that you had been dying to read, or a tool that you had been desperate to try out. Whatever it may of been, once received the fervor got lost and the item almost forgotten about. (If this is true, the reality is that we probably did not need that thing anyway).

However, some Christians do this with their faith and their relationship with Jesus Christ, which is the one thing we all desperately need more of everyday. At one point, there is great excitement about becoming a believer. Then, as years go on, complacency sets in with our Christian faith, and Jesus takes a back seat to what falsely seems to be more important things. This is not a wise path to follow.

To know Jesus is to not only have a head knowledge about who He is, but it is also to participate in what He wants to do through us. This is not something we just wake up one day and instantly accomplish. It is something we learn day by day as we take up our cross to follow Him. We walk and talk with the Lord Jesus through prayer, Bible reading and devotion, and work to glorify Him in all that we say and do.

1 Corinthians 1:18 says, "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." Notice the tense of the verb "being saved." It is present tense and it refers to the process by which the cross of Christ transforms us with the power of God.

Salvation in Christ is transformative in so many ways! Our transformation is a daily process as the power of God works in our minds and our hearts so that we can be made more and more into the image of Jesus Christ our Savior. Then, as that power wells up within us, we can live more and more faithfully the life that He calls us to live by loving God and loving one another. This is exactly why we can never put our Christian faith in a drawer or the cross in a closet to be forgotten about.

So, remember the cross of Jesus and what He did for us and by God's power live everyday for Him!
