

Dear Church Family,

Not long after this edition of the monthly newsletter, we will celebrate the ups and downs of Holy Week—Jesus' journey to the cross. Then comes the pinnacle event of our Christian faith—the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, without which there would be no basis for hope in Christ, or a Christian faith at all. The pivotal events of Holy Week are a fulfillment of Jesus' earthly work and teaching. It inaugurates the Kingdom of God breaking through to the earth in new way that had yet to be revealed. Our crucified Savior returns from death to rule in a way that no one can touch nor defeat.

When we enter into life with Christ, we become subjects of the kingdom. The challenge is that inauguration means something has begun, but is not yet complete. A new reign of God exists in the world, one without typical geographical borders to dispute (think of the Russian invasion of Ukraine). Instead, we serve as ambassadors in a foreign land. Jesus is King, but until He returns again for the final judgment, we are representatives of a spiritual kingdom without clear boundaries. So, what do we do with all of this?

Later on in the Book of Acts, we know Jesus sends the apostles out to spread the good news that this kingdom has come into being. The good news of Christ as king, who has control over life AND death, should convict us to respond as well. Part of that response is Christian mission. The word "mission" is used widely in the modern church as work that proclaims the good news, serves the poor, and seeks God's peace and justice in the world. As subjects of Jesus' kingdom, we take part in that work on behalf of our king.

We have an incredible privilege to participate in and celebrate mission here at Clen-Moore. We recently shared that the Mission and Evangelism Committee requested and received grant applications to help provide funding to our mission partners above and beyond our regular annual support. Thanks to generous estate giving and other surplus mission funds, we were able to gift \$95,000 to these five mission partners:

- ~5 Star Global Outreach—\$35,000 for a solar system that will stabilize their work in Haiti, where electricity is unreliable and expensive in rural areas.
- ~ Promise of Life Network—\$20,000 to use toward building repairs and improvements for their New Castle facility.
- ~CRU—\$20,000 to help Randy and Megan Veccia secure housing near Slippery Rock University as an outreach to students.
- ~Pine Valley Camp—\$10,000 toward construction of their new dining hall.
- ~New Castle Christian Academy—\$10,000 toward the campaign to replace their current heating system.

As we rejoice in and share the hope of the resurrection, be sure to celebrate the impact we can have for God's kingdom. We don't do this out of pride or to boast. Rather, we praise God that we've been able to support these missions and the people they serve in a tangible way. After all, ministry and mission for Jesus is always about people.
