Hallelujah! Christ is Risen! This has been the resounding truth of Easter in the church for 2,000 years. Even though Easter is on one given Sunday, the church's liturgical calendar celebrates it every Sunday until Pentecost. This block of time is known as the Easter season. Part of the reason for this is so we do not too quickly forget to live out the message of resurrection. Because in reality, Easter is what we live out our whole lives!

We were reminded this Easter to allow the power of God, who raised Jesus from the dead, to live in and through us and challenge the way that we live in the world. This includes how we love others. One thing that Jesus' resurrection changes for the Christian is the way look at others, or at least the way we ought to look at them.

Matthew 7:2 says, "For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." (NIV) There is a famous story about how one day Michelangelo was walking in Florence, Italy when he came across a piece of discarded marble. Rather than leave it lie there, he had the piece of marble brought to his studio. After examining it, he noticed that someone had already started to work on the marble, but had obviously cast it out as useless.

Michelangelo said, "There is an angel imprisoned in this piece of marble, and it is my task to bring out that angel." Michelangelo had the insight to see something beautiful within what another saw as rubbish. He just had to take the time to work with the marble and let the angel out. This is exactly what our business is as we strive to see the image of God in other people, to see them in the light of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. A grace and mercy that we ourselves do not deserve, but freely receive.

Everyone has been created in the image of God. When we live in God's resurrection power, Jesus not only helps God's image be revealed in us, but Jesus helps us to see the good in other people, the potential they have in Christ. In short, He helps us to love them, even when others do not and the world tells us we should not.

Christ-like love comes about through kindness, gentleness, and understanding. These things along with love, meaningful relationships, and the work of the Spirit are the tools that God uses to chip away the marble that is encasing who is really inside.

Death and resurrection is the power that reshapes and renews us. The Easter season reminds us that we are to both live into this power and to share it with others. The resurrection of Jesus Christ changes everything, including the way that we look at others and judge one another.

May God grant that we will become people who release the "angels" imprisoned in the twisted forms of humanity. May God's resurrection power save us from joining the ranks of those who stand idly by, doing little to nothing, and only pointing out the flaws and faults in others.

Find someone in your life, in your neighborhood, in your workplace, in your school, where ever God reveals them to you, and let God work his resurrection power through you as you love them in spite of what is encasing their true selves in Christ.

"Celebrate Spring Showers:

A walk in the rain lets you soak in sights, smells, sounds, and textures you would never notice on a sunny day. 

Mission Spotlight! May-Pine Valley Camp, Ellwood City



Although Pine Valley Camp has been around since 1961, its mission changed in 1995 to a focus on rebuilding broken lives through Jesus Christ. This is when Pine Valley Camp became part of the Nehemiah Project, its partner ministry, which provides residential camping and enables urban and at-risk youth from the wider-Pittsburgh area and beyond, to experience camp.

Pine Valley Camp believes that fun builds the bridge to the heart of a kid. Therefore, they help kids experience God through creation, a loving community, and the gospel of Jesus Christ. Campers have a variety of opportunities to experience all of this fun through various age specific camps, starting at 6 years old all the way up to 15 years old, before they can become workers and counselors themselves.

Each of the camps brings the kids through an intentional step program that helps the child develop in their faith and awareness of their God-given gifts so they become faithful, serving, and passionate followers of Jesus Christ and great assets to their communities around them.

Clen-Moore Church has been financially supporting and praying for Pine Valley Camp for many years. The youth group and 1-2-1 program have served several dinners for camp, a group of volunteers went down for a work day to help in the building of the Lodge, we have heard from their directors during a moment for mission several times, and we have hosted the Light of the City Kid's Choir two different times.

We are grateful for the opportunity that God has given our church family to continue to support the Christ-centered ministry of Pine Valley Camp.
