Dear Church family,

If someone were to write a biography about your life, do you think that a large part of it would be about the events that happened in one week's time? Is there a week in your life that is so important that it is worth spending the majority of ink on? That is exactly what the Gospel writers do in regards to the life of Jesus. Although the Gospels do reveal some of the historical life and events of Jesus Christ, they are much more than simple biographical information about Him. They are the good news of God's kingdom come in the person and work of Jesus, God's one and only unique Son. The gospel message is one of redemption and rescue, salvation and freedom, death and resurrection, obedience and faithfulness.

All 4 Gospels agree that the last week, more specifically the last 8 days, of Jesus' life was of utmost importance. In relation to chapters, Matthew devotes about 30% of his gospel to it, Mark roughly 40%, Luke 25%, and John devotes nearly half of his Gospel to the last week of Jesus' life on earth. Even the Apostles' Creed follows suit on this emphasis.

There is no wonder then that the church calls this week "Holy Week." Traditionally, Holy Week is Palm Sunday through Saturday. However, we can call it Holy Week plus One. It is a week like no other the world has ever seen or will ever see again. Beginning with the triumphal entry into Jerusalem and concluding with Jesus' death and resurrection, Holy Week plus One is a very special time in the life of the church that beckons believers to refocus our lives on Christ and to reflect on who He is and what He has done for the world.

Jesus came to earth to bring about God's kingdom, to be true Israel for the world. All of His teachings, miracles, and relationships, His very purpose and life, have led Him to the cross and death. Yet, Holy Week has plus One. The 8th day, as we sometimes call it, says that death was not the final word over Jesus. "He is risen!" are the words that echo from the heights of the heavens to the depths of the sea. These three words change everything. "He is risen!" is the culmination of Holy Week and of all that God set out to do through His Son. "He is risen!" is the rally cry that the church embodies and proclaims to the world. "He is risen!" is the faith that we confess, calling us to discipleship and to make disciples. There is no other story, no other week (Sunday), no other proclamation so important as this.

The New Testament letters follow the Gospels and they are the ongoing work of Holy Week and Easter. Paul, Peter, James, John, along with so many other men and women throughout the centuries have picked up and embodied the events of Holy Week and the rally cry of, "He is risen!" How will you pick it up and allow it to flood your life? May the good news of "He is risen!" saturate your very being so much so that you can never turn from it to the left or the right, but seek to live it day and day out. May you truly have a Blessed Holy Week and a Happy Easter!

We invite you to join us for worship this Holy Week. On Palm Sunday, April 2, the children will process and sing along with the choir. On Maundy Thursday, April 6, we will have a tenebrae-like service with Scripture readings, prayer, music, and communion at 7:00 PM. Then, Easter, we have a special early service at 8:00 AM followed by breakfast at 8:30, Sunday School, and worship at 10:30 AM celebrating the great day of resurrection. Come and invite a family member or friend to take this journey of Holy Week plus One with you.

- Pray for our Christian partners still living in Khartoum, Sudan. They are under brutal military control. They are still pressing on and sharing the Good News. They also provide Theological education.
