Dear church family,

Building off of last week's chapter in The Story, we continue to think about the leadership and organization of our church and the ways in which the whole congregation plays a part in it. By the time this newsletter will reach you, we will have held a congregational meeting to elect officers for new terms beginning in 2024. This month I want to focus on the work of our elders.

If you have ever wondered where we get the word "Presbyterian" from, it derives from the Greek New Testament word "presbuteros" which roughly translates to elder. This means that our church and others who are part of the Presbyterian tradition are churches that are led by elders. Though I (Michael) serve as the primary shepherd of our flock, I do so in conjunction with the session—which is the name given to the board of elders who commit to spiritual and administrative leadership for the church. A somewhat little-known fact is that the pastor in a Presbyterian church technically has little power to make many of the decisions, most of which are entrusted to the session, with a few designated for the entire congregation to discern and vote.

Unlike some church traditions where the pastor, bishop or pope may singlehandedly discern the will of God for a local congregation, the beauty of our leadership system is that a group of people discern the will of Christ together. As your pastor, I find this comforting, because though I hope my leadership is inspired and led by the Lord's will, sometimes I can get in the way of that. We are all sinners, broken and incapable of perfection on this side of eternity. The upcoming chapters of The Story we will read this month cover the life of King Saul and those who served after him. It is fascinating to me that God did not want to put just one person in charge (read 1 Samuel 8-9 for the whole picture), but eventually God relents and lets Saul serve in this way. Over the long haul, the idea of having just one person as the spiritual and administrative leader of Israel does not work well.

It is for this reason and for many others I am grateful to lead our congregation in conjunction with our elders. Most importantly, as your pastor, with the elders and members of the congregation, we live and serve by the leadership of THE one and only King—Jesus Christ. Sometimes we will fall short of correctly discerning His will, but if we keep our eyes focused on the true leader of our lives, we will stay on the right path together. If you have served as an elder in the past, are currently serving, or are open to this call upon your life in the future, THANK YOU. Our church would not exist without God's people responding to the call. For those who have not, stay tuned, because in the next couple of months we will highlight three more main areas of service in our church where you can contribute.


"Serving Those who Serve within the Body of Christ."


