

Dear church family,

As we begin a New Year, we continue to look at the leadership and organizational structure of our church, and come to one of our newest groups—the "Ministry and Mission Team." The work of this group, however, is not new by any means; rather it is the unifying of the previous committees of Worship and Music (W&M), Christian Education (CE), and Mission and Evangelism (M&E) into one cohesive team. This is a good area to kick off 2024, because this shift can help explain our trajectory as a church into the future.

There are a few realities and observations that I have made over the past five years, and one of them is probably obvious—as it is for many churches, we have gotten smaller in number. Much of our church's committee structure was formed for an organization that was much larger -- twice, if not several times bigger than the current size of our congregation. The point is less about whether that is good or bad, as much as it is to name our current reality. When the size of an organization is reduced, the structure that makes it hum needs to be adjusted proportionally to serve it well.

We are blessed to have many talented, inspired, Godly servants doing many great things in our church and beyond. But another observation I have is that these individuals and small groups often are not on the same page as one another. I recall several evenings of committee meetings where one group would plan an event for the same date and time as another, not realizing it until after the fact! While that may sound like a simple miscommunication, it highlights my first point—smaller churches need to focus their efforts on the effectiveness of programs and events, rather than strive for a larger quantity of them.

The crossover between these three committees is also a huge reason for consolidation. Is the children and youth Christmas musical a CE-sponsored event or W&M? Is the annual Christmas float an outreach of M&E, or a CE program? When a missionary presents in Sunday school, is that organized by CE or M&E? By teaming up as one, we do not have to differentiate between them. There are still certainly people who serve on the team because their passions and gifts are related to these original areas, but now all those hearts and minds are together in the same room.

Can or should a church of our size just have one team, committee, or board that does everything? Of course not. But the more we can be together on the same page, working together in ministry and mission, the more effective our efforts will be. We have already begun to see great synergy in this newly molded group this past year. If you feel God is calling you to lead a ministry, program, small group, service project, or anything else—come join us! The session may be the spiritual and administrative leaders of our church, but the ministry and mission team is the heart and soul of our life together. As I close, be reminded of our calling to unity by the apostle Paul in Ephesians 4:1-6:

"I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call—one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all."

I pray that we would continue to be one by the Lord's leading, as we seek to worship and serve together in 2024 and beyond!
