Dear Church Family,

First, I want to thank you all for following along as we have spent the majority of the last seven months in "The Story". By the time this month is over, we will have completed a 31-week/chapter journey through the Bible. One of my passions is to help Christians discover that one of the foundational keys to having a strong faith is by knowing the entire Bible, not just the New Testament. This series helped to give a solid overview of this, though it is not a true replacement for reading the entire Bible cover to cover. I pray that with this first step, we will all keep diving deeper into scripture and discover what the Lord has in store for us.

Without forgetting the final weeks of this series that focus on the New Testament letters, I want to take a moment to look ahead. In May we will shift to a new series, which I promise will not be nearly as long. While reading and studying the Bible should always be a spiritual exercise and not just an academic or knowledge-based pursuit, at times "The Story" could emphasize the knowing, focusing a bit less on the spiritual. That will all change as we begin our new series in adult Sunday school and worship based on the book "Hearing God" by Dallas Willard. We will be in this study for a total of six weeks throughout May and June, with a Sunday or two off during that stretch.

At the end of the 'a word from the author' section, Willard writes: "My hope is that this book will help you develop an ongoing relationship with God that will involve conversation, communion and consummation." If our spiritual lives in Christ are not seeking, or able to work toward these ends, we are missing the fullness of what we are offered in Jesus. Willard continues on to say in various places and ways that the difficulty we face is actually knowing and understanding how "Hearing God" truly works. In the forward by James Bryan Smith, he notes that the following questions (among others) are ones that Willard answers in the book, which we will also explore through teaching and preaching:

- How do we know when we are in God's will?
- How do you know it is God who is speaking with you?
- What about when we do not hear from God?
- How do I know I am not hearing the voice of Satan?
- Why do some people hear God speaking and not others?
- What should I think when someone tells me that God has spoken to them?

If these questions resonate with you, then this series is probably for you!

If you are interested in reading the book through the series, you can find it almost anywhere books are sold. This is not at all required to take part in Sunday school or the sermon series, but we will share which chapters of "Hearing God" correspond with each upcoming week for those who want to dig deeper and read along. (Note, the actual book is nine chapters, plus an intro and an epilogue, so it isn't as straightforward as one chapter per week.) We may watch video excerpts in Sunday school of Willard teaching, or conversations around a table he had with Richard Foster and John Ortberg on various topics in the book. The great news is there are free resources available at www.dwillard.org if you would like to view them for your own personal study.

As we prepare to transition from a long teaching and preaching series into a much shorter one, my hope and prayer is that it will help us all grow in a deeper relationship with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
