Dear Church Family,

Several months ago, we received and discussed items pertaining to our annual reports at our beginning of the year congregational meeting. It's always hard to believe how quickly time passes, as we find ourselves more than a quarter of the way through 2024. If you recall my report, I took time to reflect on 2023 and cast a broad picture of hopes and dreams for this year. As winter transitions into spring and with a lot of new things happening in the life of our church, I want to revisit some of the thoughts I shared back in February and note ways that we're already seeing some of them come to fruition.

One goal or aspiration that I shared for 2024 was to see Clen-Moore Church shift and become a mission outpost unto itself and to do more outreach to our neighbors. The specific idea I mentioned was being more intentional about inviting (i.e. "recruiting") members of our community to join the softball team.

In a similar way, we decided to provide hospitality to our community on voting day. Rather than ask people to buy from a bake sale, we reversed it and offered treats (and some kind words) to those gracing our doors. These are great tangible steps toward creating a culture that is outwardly focused!

Clen-Moore has also formed a new local mission partnership between "The Neighborhood Pantry" in Mahoningtown, our church garden, and the blessing box installed on Albert Street between our building and New Castle Christian Academy. While we are still exploring the ways in which these groups and activities might work together, we can see that God is at work. A lot of seeds have been planted—I'm eager to see how God makes them grow!

A long-term goal that I believe is important for Clen-Moore's longevity is finding new and innovative ways to use our building. We have a large, beautiful building. That in turn often means higher expenses. Though we have barely begun to scratch the service of utilizing it fully, I wanted to share a few ways in which we are blessing others with using our church building.

- Since the months following the pandemic, we opened our building to a local house church that didn't feel comfortable properly distancing inside the home where they normally met (when they couldn't meet outside due to the weather). So, if you see people eating and worshipping in Fellowship Hall or our youth room on Sunday morning—say hello to our brothers and sisters in Christ from Discipleship Community Church, or DC3 for short. They are led by Pastor Craig Cole, who has preached at Clen-Moore in the past.
- We are also hosting a Quaker group led by our friends and neighbors, David and Melodi Goff. For those
 who might wonder—YES, they are Christians, but they have different worship traditions. If you'd like to
 learn more, David will be teaching a three-week Sunday School class on the history, theology, and
 practice of the Quakers later this summer.
- Last but not least, we now have two PEO groups who use our space. This is a philanthropic scholarship
 organization specifically for women. While their work is not overtly a Christian ministry or mission, we
 are glad to offer space for their good work in our community.

As I close, I thought it appropriate to share these words from Mark 9:38-41: "John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone using your name to cast out demons, but we told him to stop because he wasn't in our group." "Don't stop him!" Jesus said. "No one who performs a miracle in my name will soon be able to speak evil of me."

This is a simple reminder that we can and should seek partners in ministry and enable good works in our community. As peacemakers in this world, one of the small things we can do in our corner of New Castle is provide opportunities and spaces where our community feels welcome. Our church property and our relationships with people are the gateway to someone coming to Christ—we should do our best to provide an environment that is inviting.


